ROOTED IN REGENERATION (RNR) Rooted in Regeneration (RNR) is a program for eligible farmers to receive a deduction on the interest rate for mortgages with Iroquois Valley. This program began as a pilot in 2022.	 Farmers who are: Seeking a mortgage with Iroquois Valley Meet the <u>USDA NRCS definition of Socially Disadvantaged</u>, and Use conservation practices on their farming operation. 	Farmers may qualify for a deduction on the interest rate for a mortgage with Iroquois Valley. Using our standard underwriting process, we apply a rate reduction for eligible borrowers that looks favorably at factors like conservation practices, and dealsize up to \$500,000. The mortgage interest rate can be reduced up to 2.0%.	There is no separate application or sign-up process for this program. If you are interested in a mortgage with Iroquois Valley and meet eligibility requirements, you will automatically be considered for the RNR program.
SOIL RESTORATION POOL (SRP) The Soil Restoration Pool (SRP) is an internal grant program for farmers in our portfolio to receive funding for soil health and conservation projects. Farmers can apply for up to \$8,000 per project.	 Farmers who are: Active recipients of an Iroquois Valley mortgage, lease, and/or line of credit Use soil health or conservation practices on their farming operation. 	We are interested in funding any practices that help build soil on your farm. This is a reimburseable grant that can cover a variety of costs, including cover crop seed, movable fencing materials for rotational grazing, materials for habitat restoration, agroforestry, and more.	The application for the SRP grant program opens each year. If you are in the company's portfolio, you will receive an email when the application cycle begins, and a reminder from your relationship manager.
Iroquois Valley has a variety of partnerships with other organizations to help farmers access support for their operations.	Eligibility for these other services vary depending on experience, region, and availability.	 We have two active grant partnerships: Business and financial planning support to beginning farmers and ranchers Organic transition incentives to transitioning farmers in north central Illinois.
